Comment on some specific units you can use to incorporate effectively episodes in the history of mathematics into the teaching of mathematics. Include links to relevant websites.
- 2. Before Tuesday, March 7. Select one of the ideas you have encountered during the Forum discussion and be prepared to talk about it during the Centra session for about 5 minutes. It might be helpful to appshare the relevant website or other material.
