1. Consider the geometric series $2 - \frac{4}{3} + \frac{8}{9} - \frac{16}{27} + \dots$.

(a) Write the series in summation notation.

(b) Does the series converge? If yes, find the sum of this series.

2. For each of the following series, determine whether it converges or diverges. Show your justifications and state the name of the convergence test you use.

(a)
$$\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{2n^2 + 3^n}{-3 + 2(5^n)}$$

(b)
$$\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{n^2 - 2n + 3}{n^3 + 4n - 2}$$

2. (continued)

(c) $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{n2^n}{n!}$

(d) $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \left(\frac{n^2 + 2}{2n^2 - n + 5} \right)^n$

3. Show that the alternating series $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} (-1)^n \frac{n}{20n^2 + 1}$ is convergent. How many terms in the partial sum S_n of the series do we need in order to find an approximate sum with error less than 0.01? Write down (but do not compute) this partial sum.

4. Find the radius of convergence and the interval of convergence of the power series $\sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(-2)^n}{2n+1} x^n$. Show your justifications and be sure to check end points.

5. Find a power series representation for the function $f(x) = \frac{x}{(2-x^2)^2}$. Determine the radius of convergence.

6. Let $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} a_n$ be a convergent series and let S be its sum. Let $S_n = \sum_{i=1}^n a_i$ be the n -th partial sum. Answer each of the following questions; **no justification** is needed.

(a) What is $\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} S_n$?

(b) What is $\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} a_n$?

(c) If $a_n > 0$ for all n , is $\{S_n\}$ an increasing or decreasing sequence? Find an upper bound and a lower bound for $\{S_n\}$, if they exist.

(d) Let $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} b_n$ be another series and let $T_n = \sum_{i=1}^n b_i$ be its partial sum. If $0 < b_n < 2a_n$ for all n , find an upper bound and a lower bound for $\{T_n\}$, if they exist.
