password and follow the instructions to register. Thus if your username `jcali222`  
you would enter `ad\jcali222` as your username at [www.mathclass.org](http://www.mathclass.org). You will  
not be able to log in until the next business day after you register for the class with  
the registrar's office. Do not begin with the **Register in WHS** link.
