All students will have from 2pm on Friday April 17 until 1pm on Wednesday April 22 to complete the take-home exam.

Please carefully read instructions below. Failure to comply with any of the instructions below may result in our being unable to accept or grade your exam or initiating disciplinary actions. Thease instructions apply from 2pm on Friday April 17 until 1pm on Wednesday April 22.

- 1. This exam is "open book", which means that you are permitted to use the textbook, your own notes from the course, and the homework assignments from the course.
- 2. The exam must be taken completely alone. Showing it or discussing it with anyone is forbidden.
- 3. You *may not* consult any external resources. This means no internet searches, materials from other classes, other books, or any notes you have taken from other classes, etc. You may not use Google or any other search engines for any reason. You may not use any shared Google documents, or any other type of shared documents.
- 4. You may not consult with any other person regarding the exam. You may not check your exam answers with any other person. You may not discuss any of the materials or concepts in MA 661 with any other person.
- 5. Your answers can be either typed by LateX or handwritten. In either case, make sure that your solution is neat and organized.
- 6. The exam should be submitted at the beginning of lecture on Wednesday April 22, or any time earlier to me *in person*.
- 7. In case you are wondering about how many problems there will be on the exam, it is designed to be a 3-hour long exam, even though you are allowed to spend as much time as you want during the specified time period.
- 8. To receive full credit, you must show all your work. You may quote any results discussed in lecture and in homework assignments, but state explicitly what is used. You *may not* quote directly exercises in the textbook (unless they are also in homework assignments).
