2. Avery and Chandler are looking at a 2-bedroom apartment for \$500 per month plus the cable bill. They are trying to come to a rental agreement where they choose rooms, choose a cable plan, divvy up the chores, and split the rent. They are ok splitting things "unevenly" as long as both (i) Avery thinks Avery is getting more than Avery is paying for, and (ii) Chandler thinks Chandler is getting more than Chandler is paying for.

The rooms look the same to you, but Avery likes the Front room better because of the view, and Chandler likes the Front room better because it has a nicer closet. If forced to put a number on it, Avery would pay \$300 for the Front room and \$230 for the Back room, while Chandler would pay \$260 for the Front room and \$220 for the Back room.

(a) Who should get which room? Explain why.

Avery and Chandler are considering Cable for \$45 a month and Premium Cable for an extra \$50 per month (and it requires regular cable). Avery would be happy paying anything less than \$10 for regular cable, but would personally pay up to \$20 (total) per month to have both regular cable and premium cable together. Chandler also is only willing to pay \$10 for regular cable, and would go up to \$25 (total) per month for both.

(b) Should they get premium cable, just regular cable, or no cable at all? Explain why.

They are also nervous about who cleans the main room and who cleans the kitchen. Avery would pay Chandler \$5 a month to take care of the living room and \$20 a month to take care of the kitchen. On the other hand, if Avery is forced to do the living room, that's \$5 a month, and \$20 a month if forced to clean the kitchen. Chandler's prices are \$10 a month for the living room and \$5 a month for the kitchen. (Either Avery pays Chandler to clean them, or for Chandler to pay Avery to clean them.)

(c) Who should clean the living room? Who should clean the kitchen? Explain why.

Assume Avery gets the Front room and has to clean the living room, Chandler gets the Back room and has to clean the kitchen, and together they get regular cable but not premium.

(d) What is the most Avery is willing to pay a month for this arrangement?

(e) What is the most Chandler is willing to pay a month for this arrangement?

(a) Bryan happily pays \$8 a month for standard definition Netflix streaming on one screen. Jordan also is only willing to pay \$30 for regular cable, and would go up to \$45 (total) per month for both.

(b) Should they get premium cable, just regular cable, or no cable at all? Explain why.

They are also nervous about who cleans the main room and who cleans the kitchen. Chris would pay Jordan \$5 a month to take care of the living room and \$20 a month to take care of the kitchen. On the other hand, if Chris is forced to do the living room, that's \$5 a month, and \$20 a month if forced to clean the kitchen. Jordan's prices are \$10 a month for the living room and \$5 a month for the kitchen. (Either Chris pays Jordan to clean them, or for Jordan to pay Chris to clean them.) Casey and Taylor are considering Cable for \$45 a month and Premium Cable for an extra \$50 per month (and it requires regular cable). Casey would be happy paying anything less than \$15 for regular cable, and would pay up to \$55 (total) per month to have both regular cable and premium cable together. Taylor also is only willing to pay \$15 for regular cable, but would go up to \$60 (total) per month for both regular and premium.

(b) Should they get premium cable, just regular cable, or no cable at all? Explain why.

They are also nervous about who cleans the main room and who cleans the kitchen. Casey would pay Taylor \$10 a month to take care of the living room and \$15 a month to take care of the kitchen. On the other hand, if Casey is forced to do the living room, that's \$10 a month that Casey expects off their rent, and \$15 a month if forced to clean the kitchen. Taylor's prices are \$20 a month for the living room and \$25 a month for the kitchen. (Either

 $Casey \ pays \ Taylor \ to \ clean \ them, \ or \ for \ Taylor \ to \ pay \ Casey \ to \ clean \ them.)$

(c) Who should clean the living room? Who should clean the kitchen? Explain why.

Assume Casey gets the Front room and has to clean the living room, Taylor gets the Back room and has to clean the kitchen, and together they get both regular cable and premium cable.
