**Meetings**: For the time being, class meetings will be conducted via Zoom and the link is available through Canvas. Students are highly encouraged to have their webcams on during the class as it facilitates group work and camaraderie when you are able to see each other. If this is not possible, please consider uploading a picture of yourself as an avatar.

The room in Student Center A350 is available for our use MWF 8–8:50am. During the weeks of our exams, I will be making use of that room for any in-person meetings and review sessions. This room can also be used during class time if there is interest amongst students to meet and work in small groups in-person. I am happy to help with organizing study groups.
